Mayor's Comments

<u>Mayor Crowley</u> stated that in the past year a lot has happened. They had successfully applied for a waiver of a COAH payment with the help of Senator Oroho's office and COAH. The waiver eliminated an unfair COAH payment for a house that was burnt down on Rutherford Avenue and also resulted in an important change on a statewide basis to the COAH regulations.

<u>Mayor Crowley</u> thanked the businesses for their commitment at the Franklin Hardyston Business Appreciation breakfast lunch. The businesses that were acknowledged from Franklin were Westwind Manor, Starbucks and the Irish Cottage. The Mayor represented the Boroughs interests through correspondences and appearances with local agencies, especially COAH and NJDEP about the rules that threatened the Borough's sustainability and the County.

<u>Mayor Crowley</u> stated he formed a Re-development Committee in Franklin that will continue. He also formed a Plan Endorsement Committee of citizens to advise the Borough to implement a process for plan approval which meets the obligations by the state. He discussed that the Borough received a \$15,000.00 grant from the Highlands to assess conformance to the Highlands Plan and this does not mean we bought into the plan. We have gotten an application for a big box. It would provide the largest ratable. There has been a new shopping center approved at the north end of the Borough, Franklin Shopping Plaza was granted approval for site plan and when the economy turns this will also bring a large ratable to town.

<u>Mayor Crowley</u> discussed the construction of new affordable housing project for 93 units for age restrict housing to help the seniors with low to moderate income. There is approximately 290,000 square feet of new commercial space approved for construction when the economy turns around. We are not counting on it until it is in the ground and we get revenue. Hopefully in the future we will be getting new ratables. We also have 275 approved residential units of which 100 are under construction.

Scott Road project has finally come to an end. The road is re-opened. The quarry zone has been re-zoned. There is a new company in the Quarry area.

The Mayor welcomed Starbucks and several other businesses including those on Main Street. The Edison School House / Hungarian Church had final approval for construction.

To cut costs benefits have been eliminated to the governing body. The police department has been brought down to the right size and brought back to conformance with its budget. There has been no money taken out of the police department's budget.

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The Borough approved a new solid waste agreement which is saving the Borough money. The Borough has entered into a shared services agreement with Hardyston for the Construction Department which saves tens of thousands of dollars and we are looking into a new insurance carrier which will save approximately \$40,000.00. We cannot rely on the state financially. The Mayor does not think the Borough will get state aid next year. We will have a very tight budget next year. There has been much revitalization on Main Street.

The Mayor discussed that the town work is done by staff and paid people, everyone needs to realize that most of the work is done by the volunteers. The Mayor thanked all the volunteers for their work. If the volunteers were not here everything would grind to a halt. The Mayor thanked Freeholder Crabb for coming out to the meeting tonight.

Council Comments

<u>Mr. Stoll</u> wished everyone a happy and healthy New Year. He hopes that the Borough can maintain the services without a burden to the taxpayers. He grew up in town, it is a booming town. He discussed the economic situation locally and around the world.

<u>Mr. Limon</u> thanked the first aid squad. He thanked Senator Oroho and Freeholder Crabb for all their help. He discussed the hard decisions that the Council will have to make in the future. He discussed a health benefit levy for employees. He asked that the public to continue to submit suggestions.

<u>Ms. Miller</u> thanked her family. She thanked Rich Wolak for his help and Freeholder Crabb for coming. She also thanked Allison McHose. She promised she would do the best job she is capable of doing. She thanked all.

<u>Mr. Zschack</u> thanked his family and all those that supported him. He looks forward to making decisions with the Council.

<u>Mr. Barton</u> welcomed Ms. Miller to the Council. He thanked all for their support. He thanked the Council for electing him to Council President. He added that ratables will help the Boroughs taxes being lowered.

Phil Crabb, County Freeholder congratulated everyone. He explained that it is going to be a challenging year. There is no doubt that the volunteers are the backbone of a municipality. Share Services are getting town leaders to collaborate with each other.

Rich Wolak offered his comments to the public. He thanked everyone for their support.

Adjournment

There being no further items for discussion by the Mayor and Council, <u>Mr. Stoll</u> made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:42 PM, seconded by <u>Mr. Limon.</u> All were in favor.
