PRESENTATION

Mr. Kilduff, Community Development Director, and Mr. Knutelsky, Borough Engineer, gave a presentation to the Council on Franklin Borough's Sewer Service Area Mapping presently being revised by the NJDEP. Mr. Knutelsky explained the proposed maps showing the reduction of the Borough's Sewer Service Area submitted by the NJDEP and the County of Sussex. Mr. Knutelsky then explained the map proposed by the Borough which will be submitted to the County and NJDEP, if the Council approves, which shows certain proposed developments included in the sewer service area. A lengthy discussion followed the presentation.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Mr. Stoll</u> reported that salt is a big expense this year; the cost is \$68.95 per ton. It takes one ton for one mile of road plus. There are forty eight miles of road. We are using more liquid magnesium chloride that cost \$1.24 per gallon.

Mr. Limon reported that the Recreation Commission meets tomorrow.

Mr. Snyder asked for executive session for personnel.

<u>Mr. Zschack</u> reported that two applications were deemed complete and testimony will be heard at the next meeting. WalMart final site plan was carried to the next meeting. He asked for executive session for police negotiations. He and Mr. Snyder will be attending the school budget meetings.

<u>Mr. Barton</u> handed out reports for Rt. 23 and Walsh Rd. and the recommendations from the Chief of Police.

Mr. Wolak gave his report and he asked for executive session for contracts and police negotiations and Administrative chain of command. A copy of the report is on file in the Borough Clerk's Office.

<u>Mr. Stoll</u> made a motion to open the meeting to the public for anyone wishing to address the Governing Body. Seconded by <u>Mr. Snyder</u>. All were in favor.

Mr. Frank Garrera of 14 Susquehanna stated that the Brian VanDenBroek, Water Dept. Supervisor and the Administrator refused to fix a water main break. He claims that the Borough put in the second line and his house runs off of it. The second line is not his.

Mr. Wolak explained that it is normal policy that anything after the curb stop is the homeowner's responsibility for repairs. Mr. Wolak stated that he will work to reimburse Mr. Garrera if he can prove that the Borough does own the line.

Mr. Garrera said to check with Ex-Mayor Kistle who said he would put in a one and a one half inch line and turn it over to him.

Jim Grabkowski of Ridgewood Road complained about Walsh Road and Ridgewood Road being a cut through for Hamburg and Hardyston Traffic. He claims that there is five cars per minute. Something needs to be done.

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Joanne Tatka, 151 Maple Rd., asked if the Borough pays for lunch hours. The Mayor responded "no".

She asked if the court is a self sustaining department. <u>The Mayor</u> said that they actually make money. She asked if there was a salary ordinance for 2009. She asked about delinquent taxes? Mr. Wolak explained that there will be an ordinance after negotiations and the tax collector reported a 98% collection. She asked if two policemen go to a call do they both fill out a report? <u>The Mayor</u> responded that it depends on the call.

Mary Brucato of 11 Ridgewood Road agreed with Mr. Grabkowski. Something needs to be done and you cannot walk on the street with children.

Dolores Segcum of Ridgewood Road stated that the police were sent to patrol in front of the Garnis residence at 10:00 am. They need to be there at 7:00 am. There is more traffic than ever and the drivers don't care about people on the street.

There being no one else present who wished to address the Governing Body, <u>Mr.</u> <u>Stoll</u> made a motion to close the meeting to the public, seconded by <u>Mr. Zschack.</u> All were in favor.
