Mr. Ursin informed Mr. and Mrs. Geddis that the Council has nothing to do with Land Use; they need to meet with the acting zoning officer to look through the file regarding their property.

Bob Gerry, Vernon. Mr. Gerry was representing the Homestead. He passed out to the Council information on the Homestead. Mr. Gerry stated that the Freeholders want to close the Homestead. He explained to the Council reasons why the Homestead should not be closed.

Mr. Ursin informed the Council the Freeholders vote on their issues as a Council they can't comment on internal issues of the County.

Joann Tatka, 151 Mable, Franklin stepped forward. Mrs. Tatka is waiting for information from the town regarding where the reassessment areas were done in Franklin.

Mr. Ferry explained tonight was the introduction to the 2012 Budget; the public hearing will be held April 10, 2012. The advertisement for the budget will be in the newspaper on March 30, 2012

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Mr. Ferry stated after the introduction the Council can change certain parameters. Mr. Ferry explained a handout of the Budget he gave to the Council. Mr. Ferry explained the tax rate for last year was .9011 or .90 cents this year's tax rate is .9375. The tax increase is .0363. A house assessed for \$100,000 the increase would be \$36.30 and for \$200,000 the increase would be \$72.60. Mr. Ferry explained line by line items on the hand out to the Council.

<u>Council President Zschack</u> stated we introduce the budget tonight then schedule a workshop to discuss the budget and notice the workshop in the paper.

Mr. Ferry stated we introduce the budget tonight; we can do an amendment to the budget, have a public hearing, introduce the amendment and then adopt the budget.

Mrs. Gardell asked if the budget can be placed on the website.

Mr. Ursin explained that once the budget is introduced it can be placed on the website.

<u>Mr. Giordano</u> thanked Franklin's CFO Monica Miebach for going a great job on the budget and working extra hours to have it completed for tonight's introduction.
