Mayor Crowley commented they can bring in other towns. We all had this concern as to whether or not Hardyston can fill their obligation then we would give them notice. Obviously we would talk to them before that to try to get better service.

Discussion on Route 23 Pump Station

At this time there was a discussion on the bids for Route 23 Pump Station.

Mayor Crowley said let the record show that Mark Zschack had joined the meeting.

Mayor Crowley explained the bids were opened we received a very low bid; the question is whether the contractor could do the services with the low bid. Mayor Crowley stated Tom Knutelsky, the Borough engineer, looked into this; Mr. Knutelsky went over all the items with the contractor. At this point Mr. Knutelsky does recommend accepting the lowest bid.

Mr. Kilduff said we received a letter today from Mr. Knutelsky stating that he had reviewed the four bids submitted on September 20 for the above referenced project and he recommended the contract be awarded to Longo Electrical Mechanical with the low bid of \$75,600. The Bid documents were also reviewed by our attorney Mr. Ursin and he acknowledged that these bids are available for award tonight.

Mrs. Gardell asked if there was any explanation on the difference of price; referring to the price of the pump.

Mr. Ursin commented the difference in pricing for the pump would be the brand name of the pump.

Mr. Kilduff explained the pricing of the pump.

Mr. Ursin stated the engineer has to make the determination as to whether in fact the pump is equivalent to the pump meaning it meets all the specifications and if it doesn't there will be a problem.

Mr. Kilduff stated this bid is \$53,775 less than the next lowest bid.

Mr. Ursin stated under local contract law is two folds; one is the bid compliant with the bid specifications, the low bid is yes. The second is whether the lowest bidder is a responsible bidder in the meaning of the local public contract law. That is what the engineer has looked into so far and has recommended to the Council to award the low bidder. In the contracting process if it comes up that there was a problem or a mistake or some other thing; that will come up in the contracting process. That is why there are bid bonds and those types of things. Mr. Ursin explained just because there is a gap in the bids is not a reason to reject the bid.

There was a brief discussion on the bid.

Mayor Crowley asked for a motion to accept this bid.

## Mr. Zschack made a motion to accept the bid from Longo Electrical Mechanical in the amount of \$75,000. Seconded by Mr. Giordano.

**Discussion on Well C** 

At this time there was a discussion regarding the improvements for Munsonhurst Road Well House addition of Well C.

Mayor Crowley stated the discussion on Well C is basically it is the same discussion we went out to bid; there is one very low bidder for all the same reasons. The town engineer recommends we accept the lowest bid. The engineer has checked this out and put it in writing.

Mr. Kilduff stated the bid was for \$75,089. Mr. Kilduff stated he had to clarify something for the benefit of the Council. The bid was presented at \$61,889; he asked Mr. Knutelsky what the discrepancy was he referred to the unit cost for item 14 saw cutting. Mr. Kilduff stated the low bid is \$75,089; the saw cutting number is wrong. Mr. Knutelsky has had discussions with contractor and that price will be adjusted.

Mayor Crowley asked it is still the lowest bid.

Mr. Kilduff stated yes by far.

Mayor Crowley asked Mr. Ursin if there was any problem with them adjusting this.

Mr. Ursin said mathematical errors can be corrected so long as the bid is responsible.

Mr. Kilduff commented the next lowest bid was \$102,350.

Mr. Kilduff said the low bid is DPS Pump Service LLC. they are a local company out of Hopatcong.

Mayor Crowley asked for a motion to accept this bid.

# Mr. Zschack made a motion to accept the bid from DPS Pump Service LLC. in the amount of \$75,089. Seconded by Mr. Giordano.
