MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FRANKLIN HELD AT THE FRANKLIN MUNICIPAL BUILDING 46 MAIN STREET, FRANKLIN, NJ AUGUST 18, 2020

This meeting is being held through a virtual meeting platform called ZOOM. The public has been notified and instructed on how to join the meeting and participate during the public session.

<u>Mayor Sowden</u> called the meeting to order and requested the Borough Clerk to call the roll. Upon roll call, the following members of the Governing Body were present: Mr. Formica, Mr. Postas, Mr. Skellenger, Mr. Snyder, Mr. Zydon (not heard on recording) and Mayor Sowden.

Absent: Limon

Mayor Sowden led the assembly in the flag salute.

<u>Mayor Sowden</u> stated "This meeting is being held in compliance with the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et sequentes. It has been properly advertised by posting in Borough Hall and printed in the New Jersey Herald/Sunday New Jersey Herald on January 5, 2020, and posted on the Borough website, which adequate notice has been certified by the Clerk."

PRESENTATIONS

Summary or Synopsis of 2019 Audit Report

Mr. Tom Ferry, Borough Auditor was granted permission to join the meeting. Mr. Ferry commented he will briefly go over the 2019 Audit highlights by page number, starting with page 63 statement of operations for the current fund. The current fund is where most of the tax revenues and expenditures are shown including your current budget. The statement of operations is similar to an income statement. Mr. Ferry explained revenue and expenditure balances, the tax payments the Borough made to the County and school. There was a statutory excess of almost \$239,000 which was put back into our fund balance, we then used \$650,000 to balance our budget to help keep taxes low. That caused a decrease in the fund balance, but he is not concerned; Franklin Borough's fund balance is still extremely healthy. Mr. Ferry referenced page 64, the water/sewer utility operations, explaining its revenues and expenditures; it caused almost no change in the [water/sewer] fund balance, again very healthy numbers. Mr. Ferry stated all in all the financial condition of the Borough is very good. Hopefully 2020 will be better, we will have to see what happens at the end of the year from the effects of COVID. Mr. Ferry referred to page 65, the tax collection rate, commenting the tax levy is creeping up which is caused by tax delinquencies, this isn't a good trend. Mr. Ferry explained possible scenarios that could help get properties back on a tax paying basis. Mr. Ferry also commented on debt services. The total net debt has a 3 year average of equalized value of .50 percent; statutorily municipalities are allowed to go up to 3.5 percent. The net debt number is \$2,062,000 which represents your general capital bond anticipation notes. Water/sewer debt is not included in that number because it is considered self-liquidating. This year [2020] the Borough paid off \$116,000 of our water/sewer BANS (Bond anticipation notes).

Mr. Ferry commented there are 2 comments of recommendations, one is segregation of duties which is like most of his towns in Sussex County. Mr. Ferry explained segregation of duties. Generally accepted "Government Auditing Standards" requires me to make you aware of the lack of segregation of duties. The other comment is about encumbrances. Mr. Ferry explained encumbrance systems. What is happening is some departments are purchasing without putting in an encumbrance first. The encumbrance system is set up because we do a budget and we don't want to go over the budget. What needs to happen is departments must get approvals prior to the actual purchases in order to keep from over expending. This issue has been addressed with Administrator Bonanno who has already informed those departments of the proper procedures that need to be followed.

Proclamation Recognizing former Mayor Raymond J. Hyde

Mayor Sowden requested Mr. Hyde's nephew, Mr. Snyder to read the proclamation recognizing former Mayor Raymond J. Hyde.

Mr. Snyder read the following proclamation.



Mayor Sowden commented Mr. Hyde is a remarkable man, and at 105 years God bless him.

Mr. Snyder commented Ray is the oldest of his three siblings who have all passed. Mr. Snyder reminisced about how sharp his mind was in his late 80's early 90's and he still is at 105. It is extraordinary to be a person to have the life of 105 years old.

Mayor Sowden commented he applauds him and his family for the support they gave to Franklin in the early years.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Postas had nothing to report.

Mr. Snyder reported the Personnel Committee had a meeting last week, some of the items discussed are on the regular and consent agenda this evening.

Mr. Formica reported the Finance Committee met and continued discussing options for next year.

Mr. Skellenger thanked the Recreation Committee and Mr. Formica for taking the lead on planning a 9/11 Memorial celebration since hearing NYC would be cancelling theirs. Formal invites should be going out next week. Mr. Skellenger reported movie night is Friday night, sponsored by Brick N Brew at 8:00PM, the movie is Jumanji. For those attending we remind everyone to wear masks if not able to maintain a 6 foot distance.

Mr. Zydon reported the Ordinance Committee met last Friday evening. We worked on the fence ordinance and the RV ordinance. The information has been sent to Mr. Ursin for processing into the proper format.

Ms. Bonanno had nothing to report.

Clerk Tremont had nothing to report.

Mr. Ursin had nothing to report.

Mayor Sowden requested a discussion on the possibility of transferring a property on Susquehanna Street to Habitat for Humanity. Mayor Sowden commented the house has been abandoned for many years and needs a lot of work. Ken Landrud, president of the Sussex County Habitat for Humanity has contacted him and even after discussion on the condition of the house he still expressed interest in it. Mr. Ursin has reviewed some of the completed projects done by Habitat for Humanity and has found them to be very honorable. Mayor Sowden also commented this project could help the Borough with our COAH obligations and supports this request. He would like to have Mr. Ursin prepare the paperwork for the next Council meeting to deed them the house so they can rebuild it. Mayor Sowden requested if the Council had any objections or questions.

Ms. Bonanno shared pictures of the house with the Council.

Mr. Zydon asked if the house is structurally sound.

Mayor Sowden commented Mr. Landrud believes it is sound, the house will be inspected as work progresses. They (Habitat for Humanity) have done other houses in Franklin that turned out great.

The Council had no objections with moving forward.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor Sowden directed anyone who wished to address the Governing Body to use either the "raise your hand" or dial *9 option to join.

Mr. Snyder made a motion to open the meeting to the public for anyone wishing to address the Governing Body. Seconded by Mr. Formica. All were in favor.

Matt Walters, 6-8 Corkhill Road, Apt. 2, Franklin was granted permission to join the meeting after raising his hand. Mr. Walters commented on the dangers of crossing Corkhill Road from Maple Road towards the Police Station and asked if a crosswalk could be placed there. Mr. Walters also commented on how loud it is when trucks use their "jake brakes" while traveling on Corkhill Road and requested if something can be done about them.

Mayor Sowden commented he will have the Public Safety Committee research the issues he brought forward tonight.

Mr. Landrud, Habitat for Humanity raised his hand. There was a technical problem and Mr. Landrud wasn't able to join the public session portion of the meeting.

Ann DeGrezia, 6-8 Corkhill Road, Apt. 3, Franklin was granted permission to join the meeting after raising her hand. Ms. DeGrezia commented she also has the same concerns that Mr. Walters spoke about on the dangers of crossing Corkhill Road. Ms. DeGrezia also commented if the location of the mailboxes for the tenants living in the same building as she does can be moved to the same side of the street that her building is on. Her building is located at the corner of Maple Road and Corkhill Road and they all must cross Corkhill Road to get their mail.

Mayor Sowden commented he will have to research what can be done.

Robert Ernst, Franklin Band President, 6 Oak Street, Franklin was granted permission to join the meeting after raising his hand. Mr. Ernst thanked Mr. Formica for helping our band to find a way to continue our rehearsals in a safe location outdoors at the Franklin Pond. Mr. Ernst commented we are promoting our good name by continuing our on-line presence through YouTube and Facebook. Mr. Ernst thanked everyone for their help and support, including Mayor Sowden for recording the introduction to their first ever summer concert. It has helped us to participate in other community band events such as one in Florida where they invite bands from all over the Country to participate and we are the only band from New Jersey to do so.

Mayor Sowden thanked Mr. Ernst for all their hard work and the concerts they provide.

There being no one else present who wished to address the Governing Body, Mr. Postas made a motion to close the meeting to the public, seconded by Mr. Formica. All were in favor.
