MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FRANKLIN HELD AT THE FRANKLIN MUNICIPAL BUILDING 46 MAIN STREET, FRANKLIN, NJ MARCH 26, 2024

<u>Mayor Sowden</u> called the meeting to order and requested the Borough Clerk to call the roll. Upon roll call, the following members of the Governing Body were present: Mr. Formica, Mrs. Heath, Mr. Limon, Mr. Postas, Mr. Skellenger, Mr. Snyder and Mayor Sowden.

Absent: None

Mayor Sowden led the assembly in the flag salute.

<u>Mayor Sowden</u> stated "This meeting is being held in compliance with the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et sequentes. It has been properly advertised by posting in Borough Hall and printed in the New Jersey Herald/Sunday New Jersey Herald on January 7, 2024, and posted on the Borough website, which adequate notice has been certified by the Clerk."

PRESENTATIONS

Lorraine Hentz, Deputy County Administrator and Director of Senior Services for Sussex County, Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP). Ms. Hentz spoke about LEAP Grant opportunities. Ms. Hentz spoke regarding the possibility of creating a county recreation program for seniors by doing a shared service agreement with five to seven towns. The grant amount would be for \$400,000 for a course of a year for five municipalities (Franklin, Vernon, Frankford, Lafayette and Stillwater). There is a match to the grant of \$133,333, the county has \$80,000 of that covered. Monthly calendars would be created to show activities that are going on. This grant would be for a one-year term and applications are due April 15, 2024. It could bring a potential of \$50,000 to \$60,000 to each town that joins.

Mrs. Tremont commented that there will be a resolution of support on the next meeting of the Mayor and Council.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Limon commented that he had to cancel the public works meeting that was supposed to be yesterday. There is a water well meeting tomorrow at 5:30 and we need to discuss the new wireless water meters.

Mr. Postas commented that the EDC Committee met last week and will be adding a link to the website that would include businesses in Franklin. EDC is also working on having a pondside market this summer (June – October) once a month.

Mr. Snyder had nothing to report.

Mrs. Heath commented that Saturday March 30th is the Easter Egg Hunt at the pond.

Mr. Skellenger commented that the mobile unit from motor vehicle will be coming to Sussex Vo-Tech on April 3, 2024, from 10am until 2pm. Mr. Skellenger is hoping to do another property auction this year.

Mr. Formica commented that he spoke to Chief Cugliari and he needs to start a new list for police officers as there is no one left on the current list.

Mrs. Tremont had nothing to report.

Mr. Ursin had nothing to report.

Mayor Sowden commented that the rails to trails is tentatively starting sometime next week clearing out some of the lines. Some of you may have noticed that in the borough calendar our lineage of trails that are over along Cork Hill Road. They will be working those areas over towards Ogdensburg and working their way down to the junction area. As the program expands, the mayor has been doing some investigating with the tax assessor and we do own a rail line that goes from down in

the junction toward Hamburg and it involves one of the well areas that we will be discussing tomorrow night and this may be something we want to entertain with the state as far as selling it or being in partnership with it. This trail does require a bridge, the abutments are there but the bridge is long gone. Josh from the state has asked if occasionally the DPW could assist with the road mower with the cutting back of the bushes on the trails. The mayor wanted a consensus of the Governing Body with the DPW helping to clear some bushes, the Governing Body had no issues with DPW helping if they are available.

Mrs. Heath asked if the trail would run from Cork Hill Road all the way down to Ogdensburg.

Mayor Sowden commented that is correct.

Mayor Sowden commented that at the Historic Preservation Meeting the other night there was discussion on the roof for the Hungarian church and a quote was obtained in the amount of \$175,000.

Mrs. Heath asked where the money will come from.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION

Mr. Postas made a motion to open the meeting to the public for anyone wishing to address the Governing Body. Seconded by Mrs. Heath. All were in favor.

Thomas Prol stepped forward. Mr. Prol commented that he is the attorney for the Zinc Mine property, and he hopes the Council supports the resolution to refer it [the Zinc Mine Redevelopment Plan] to the Planning Board.

Joanne Tatka stepped forward. Mrs. Tatka thanked the council for the no parking signs at the Senior Center. Mrs. Tatka commented when clearing the trails to not forget about the ticks. Mrs. Tatka commented that the management is great at the senior center and the programs are great, it is well operated. Mrs. Tatka asked how buildings are being approved with no water allocations and where are the guiderails going on Taylor Road and Rutherford Avenue. Mrs. Tatka asked the total amount of tax collected from Ascend.

Mrs. Tremont commented that we received approximately \$1.2 million for 2023.

Mrs. Tatka asked where the money is kept from the cannabis sales.

Mr. Postas commented that the money will offset any increases. We are looking at a zero increase in taxes this year.

Mrs. Tatka asked who is at fault for the problems on Hemlock Drive.

Mr. Formica commented that the \$100,000 is the paving that we didn't finish last year.

Patti Carnes stepped forward. Mrs. Carnes commented that the egg hunt is this Saturday at 11am at the pond and the easter bunny is coming too. There will be an additional hiding of 5 eggs throughout the town for people to find for various gift cards.

Michael Raperto stepped forward. Mr. Raperto asked why porta johns are not offered year round at the pond.

There being no one else present who wished to address the Governing Body, Mr. Snyder made a motion to close the meeting to the public, seconded by Mr. Skellenger. All were in favor.
