# AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF FRANKLIN, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING SECTION 259-2, PARKING

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Franklin, County of Sussex, and State of New Jersey that the Code of the Borough of Franklin is hereby amended as follows:

# **SECTION I.**

Chapter 259-2, Parking is amended to update Section D, Parking prohibited at any time. The table in Section D is hereby amended as follows:

# **SECTION II**

Chapter 259-2, Parking is amended to update the parking time limited on Main Street. Section E, Subsection (1)(c) and Subsection (2)(c) are hereby repealed, and the Section shall read in its entirety:

E. Parking time limited on Main Street. No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit between the hours listed on any day (except Sundays and public holidays) upon the portion of Main Street described:

# (1) Southside:

- (a) Rutherford Avenue to Hudson Street: unlimited parking.
- (b) Church Street to Catlin Road: unlimited parking.

# (2) Northside:

- (a) Church Street to Town Hall: no parking.
- (b) Front of Town Hall: official parking only (police, fire, EMS).
- (c) High Street to Junction Street: no parking.
- (d) Junction Street to Parker Street: two-hour parking between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., with unlimited parking on Sundays and holidays..
- (e) Parker Street to Rutherford Avenue: no parking.
- (3) Borough Municipal Building parking lot: parking prohibited in spaces labeled employee parking; otherwise, unlimited parking provided that applicable fees are paid

### **SECTION III**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

### **SECTION IV**

If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, said article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence shall be deemed severable.

# **SECTION V**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final publication as provided by law.
